

Top Houseplants for Improving Your Indoor



Research shows indoor plants can help you live a healthier life.



Adding 2-4 houseplants for every 100 square feet can remove up to 87% of air toxins in 24 hours



According to the Environmental Protection Agency, indoor air is often filled with more chemicals than outdoor air, making it up to times more detrimental

Common sources of VOCs in your home include dry cleaning, paint, carpets, air fresheners and cleaning products

Concentrations of Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs) can be much higher indoors than outdoors





## American Red Cross Water Safety Tips

Swim in designated areas supervised by lifeguards.

Always swim with a buddy.

If you go boating, wear a life jacket!



Install and use barriers around your home pool or hot tub.



Actively supervise children whenever around the water.

Keep toys not in use away from the pool and out of sight. Always stay within arm's reach of young children and avoid distractions.

Keep your body and any tools you're holding at least 10 feet away from overhead lines. Having an outdoor party? Weight helium-filled metallic balloons so they don't float up near electric lines.



Stay away from downed. dangling or damaged power lines. **Call 911** and PG&E right away.

## Top Compressed Air Safety Guidelines



Never apply compressed air to your skin or direct it at a person



When using air for cleaning make sure pressure does not exceed 30 psig (per OSHA regulations). And always wear goggles or a face shield over approved safety glasses.



Wear ear protection. Excessive noise can damage hearing.



Never crimp, couple or uncouple pressurized hose. Shut off valve & bleed down pressure before making any hose connections.

Hose reels can decrease your chances of injury and help hoses last longer.



Use correct heavy duty clamp & fittings made for compressed air hose. Never use prayed, damaged or deteriorated hoses.



When blowing compressed air through a hose or air line, make sure the open end is held securely. A free end can whip and cause injury.





Don't use air directly from a compressor for breathing unless the system is designed for that purpose and suitable filters & regulators are in place.



Only pressure vessels built to international standards should be used for air receivers. Never install safety relief valves that have a higher PSIG rating than the pressure vessel to which you are installing.
